
Sometimes when we least expected, we obtained financial and moral support from members as far away as Kerteh and Sarawak.

MINUTES OF THE 10TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD AT 11.00 A.M. ON WEDNESDAY 22ND MARCH, 2000 AT KELAB GOLF PERKHIDMATAN AWAM, BUKIT KIARA, KUALA LUMPUR.

(ATTENDANCE: 45 MEMBERS)

MATTERS DISCUSSED

(1) The Minutes of the 9th Annual General Meeting were reviewed. No comments were raised and minutes were proposed accepted by Mr. Alexander Gabriel and seconded by Dr. Chan Chee Yan.

(2) REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

The report of the Council for 1999 was presented by the Deputy President, Dr. Ab. Rahim Mohd. Nor as the President, Dr. Samad Solbai had extended his apology due to his performing of the Haj in Mecca.

- (2.1) The Report listed a chronology of all activities held in 1999. The Council reported that activities had increased tremendously as compared to 1998. Again, the Corrosion Committee, particularly, the Coatings Sub-committee dominated the activities. The Council will endeavour to activate more activities from the other committees.
- (2.2) Memberships have grown from 146 to 369 as at 31-12-1999.
- (2.3) The IMM has established its own homepage at http://www.members.tripod.com/IMM2000.
- (2.4) IMM's e-mail address is iomm@po.jaring.my.
- (2.5) The Council established 3 new Working Committees in 1999: the Social Activities Committee, the Fabrication Technology Committee, and the Materials Consultancy Committee.
- (2.6) Links with the Institute of Materials, United Kingdom (IOM) was initiated with the visit of Ms. June Hawkins, Director of Programmes, IOM in conjunction with IMM's 10th A.G.M. The proposed collaboration between IMM and IOM received the support of the British High Commission in Kuala Lumpur. His Excellency, Mr. Graham Fry, the British High Commissioner to Malaysia, and Mr. Tim Hanson, Senior Trade Manager for Oil & Gas at the British High Commission had personally encouraged IOM to work with the IMM.

- (2.7) The Council will also look at establishing links with other international professional bodies such as National Association of Corrosion Engineers(NACE) U.S.A., Institute of Corrosion, U.K., Steel Structures Painting Council (SSPC) U.S.A., and others.
- (2.8) The Council will also attempt to obtain recognition of its professional status so that IMM professional members can obtain the international status of "Chartered Engineer" (C.Eng.) as well as "Professional Engineer" (P.Eng.)

Queries from members:-

Puan Maimunah Ismail pointed out that the Sarawak & Sabah Committee had more activities which were not recorded in the Council's Report. The point was taken note and all working committees were requested to submit their quarterly list of activities to the Secretariat for publication in the quarterly Newsletter to avoid missed-out records.

With no other queries, the Council Report was proposed accepted by Dato' Dr. Haji Mohd . Mansor Salleh and seconded by Dr. Che Husna Azhari.

(3) STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS FOR 1999

The Hon. Treasurer, Ir. Mohd. Suradi Yasin, presented the financial report for 1999.

Gross income was RM431,330 with an operating surplus of RM65,640.

The net asset of the IMM increased from RM20,911 in 1998 to RM86,551 in 1999.

With no queries from members, the financial report was proposed accepted by Mr. Kang Kim Ang and seconded by Ir. Chong Chien Fatt.

(4) HANDING OVER OF PRESIDENTIAL DUTIES

Dato' Dr. Haji Mohd. Mansor Salleh, representing the outgoing President, handed the Presidential Medal to incoming President, Dr. Ab. Rahim Mohd. Nor. In his Acceptance Speech, Dr. Rahim committed to bring IMM to greater achievements and continue the efforts to establish links with other professional institutions.

(5) ELECTIONS OF OFFICE-BEARERS FOR 2000-2002

In accordance with the Rules of the IMM, the Deputy President will take over the President's post while the posts of Deputy President, Honorary Secretary, and Honorary Treasurer were elected at the penultimate Council Meeting prior to the A.G.M.

In accordance with the IMM Rules, only seven (7) Ordinary Council Members will be elected at the A.G.M. while the balance eight (8) Ordinary Council Members will be coopted by the Council subsequently. As at 12.00 noon 10th March, 2000, the closing date for nominations, only 7 nominations for Ordinary Council posts were received by the Secretariat. As such, the 7 nominated candidates will automatically be elected as Council Members for the 2000-2002 Session.

(6) EXTERNAL AUDITOR & TAX AGENT

The Hon. Treasurer, Ir. Mohd. Suradi Yasin informed that the current external auditor & tax agent, Er & Associates had been re-appointed by the Council in accordance with the IMM Rules. As a formality, the Council wish for it to be endorsed at the A.G.M.

With no objections, the appointment was proposed accepted by Ir. Chong Chien Fatt and seconded by Mr. Alexander Gabriel.

(7) INTERNAL AUDITORS

The President requested for 2 volunteers to serve as Internal Auditors for one year. En. Noor Hisham Ab. Hamid and Mr. Alexander Gabriel volunteered to serve as Internal Auditors for 2000-2001.

(8) AMMENDMENTS TO IMM RULES

The Hon. Secretary, Ir. Ong Chong Hup, proposed that the entire Section II on Memberships be amended to correct some anomalies and also to change the title of "Member" to "Professional Member" so as to be more in line with international professional institutions.

The proposed amendments were unanimously accepted by all members present.

Mr. Kang Kim Ang proposed to accept the amendments and was seconded by Mr. David Lim Chee Cheong.

(9) OTHER MATTERS

- (9.1) Dr. Chan Chee Yan highlighted that electronic materials was becoming very important and IMM should have a Working Committee looking after this activities to achieve the target.
- (9.2) Mr. David Lim suggested that the IMM should set a target of 1000 members to be fulfilled by the next A.G.M. The Memberships Committee should plan activities to achieve the target.
- (9.3) The President informed that the Council had appointed Dato' Dr. Haji Mohd. Mansor Salleh as Honorary Fellow and ADVISOR to the IMM in accordance with the IMM Rules. The term of Advisor shall be 3 years (2000-2003).

With no other matters, the 10th Annual General Meeting ended at 12.00 noon.

PROPOSED REVISION TO IMM RULES SECTION II: MEMBERSHIP

SECTION II MEMBERSHIP

2.1 General Rules on Memberships

- 2.1.1 The Council shall establish a Memberships Committee which will be responsible for review of applications for transfer of membership grades. The Memberships Committee shall recommend transfers for Council approval at Council Meetings. All grades of memberships are awarded at the discretion of the Council and may be withheld or withdrawn in the event of conduct likely to prejudice the standing of the Institute. Every member shall receive a membership certificate.
- 2.1.2 The Memberships Committee shall be responsible for drafting the "Regulations Governing Admission and Transfer of Member Grades" for Council approval. Such regulations may be changed from time to time subject to Council approval.
- 2.1.3 Every application for membership shall be proposed and seconded according to these regulations and shall be forwarded to the Honorary Secretary who shall, at the first convenient opportunity, submit it to the Council for approval. The Council may at its discretion reject any application without assigning any reason thereof.
- 2.1.4 Each company on admission shall be entitled to nominate one representative to exercise all rights of membership. Only representatives of Company membership, Fellows (F.I.M.M.), Professional Members (M.I.M.M.), and Ordinary members shall have the right to vote and to hold office in IMM.
- 2.1.5 Only Malaysian Citizens, and Blue Identity Card Holders can become Ordinary Members, Associate Members (A.M.I.M.M.), Professional Members (M.I.M.M.) and Fellow Members (F.I.M.M.) with voting rights. Foreigners and Red Identity Card Holders can join similar grades but shall have no voting rights.

2.2 Grades

2.2.1 Honorary Fellow (Hon. F.I.M.M.)

The Council shall have the power to elect Honorary Fellows who shall be persons of eminence in science or industry. The election shall be based on a majority vote within the Council. Honorary Fellows shall enjoy such privileges as may from time to time be determined by the Council.

2.2.2 Fellow (F.I.M.M.)

A person at least 35 years of age with approved academic qualifications, training and 8 years relevant responsible experience who has made significant contributions to the science and practice of profession of Materials Science and Engineering or has given distinguished service to industry or education.

- 2.2.3 Professional Member (M.I.M.M.)
 - A person at least 25 years of age, with approved academic qualifications and training, having at least 3 years responsible experience in Materials Science and Engineering. OR
 - A person at least 40 years of age, with at least 15 years of experience with practical responsibility, as demonstrated by thesis/dissertation or report and interview.
- 2.2.4 Associate Member (A.M.I.M.M.)

A person at least 25 years of age, who possesses an interest in Materials Science and Engineering but have not acquired the necessary experience or obtained the qualifications governing entry to Member grade. An Associate Member, on obtaining the necessary qualifications, may apply for transfer to Member grade.

2.2.5 Company Member

Any company that is involved or has interest in Materials Science and Engineering will be qualified to join as a company member.

2.2.6 Ordinary Member

Any person above the age of 18 years engaged in activities related to research, development and applications in Materials Science and Engineering shall qualify for Ordinary Membership. Only Ordinary Members who meet the necessary minimum requirements may apply for transfer to membership grades of Fellow, Member and Associate Member and may use the abbreviated titles upon transfer.

2.2.7 Student Member

A student member shall be a person not under 17 years of age who at the time of application satisfies the Council that he has received a good general education and is studying subjects related to Materials Science or Engineering. A student member shall transfer to the grade of Ordinary Member after graduation provided he or she is suitably qualified and as soon as he or she is earning a full-time salary. A Student shall not become a member of the IMM without the prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor or Head of Department of the university or relevant authority concerned.

- 2.3 Admission, Election and Transfer
- 2.3.1 Applications

Admission and election to membership of the Institute and transfer in grades of membership therein shall be effected through voluntary application from persons qualified under the Rules for such membership. A Certificate of Membership will be issued to every member.

2.3.2 Honorary Fellow

An Honorary Fellow shall be elected by the unanimous vote of a meeting of the Council at which not less than two thirds of the members of the Council are present.

2.3.3 Fellows

Every proposal for transfer of a Member to the grade of Fellow shall be according to such form as the Council may prescribe. This proposal form, having been subscribed by four Professional Members (MIMM) of whom at least two shall be Fellows (FIMM), and delivered, duly completed, to the Honorary Secretary, shall be submitted to the Council, who, subject to conditions herein before set forth, may, if they think fit, approve the proposed transfer.

2.3.4 Professional Members and Associates

Any person desirous of being elected to a Professional Member or Associate shall be proposed and seconded according to such form as the Council may prescribe. The proposal form shall be signed by one Fellow (FIMM) and one Professional Member (MIMM). The proposer and seconder shall certify from personal knowledge of the candidate that he is a fit and proper person for consideration of the Council for membership in the Institute.

2.3.5 Ordinary & Students

Each candidate for admission to the grade of Ordinary, or for transfer from Student to Ordinary, shall have his application form signed by a Professional Member (MIMM). Each candidate for admission to the grade of Student shall have his application form certified by a Professional Member (MIMM) or by his employer or by a Head of Department of a teaching Institution who shall certify that the candidate is receiving or has received the required education and training. No person who is eligible for admission to the grade of Ordinary Member shall be admitted to the grade of Student or remain in the grade of Student.

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INSTITUTE OF MATERIALS, MALAYSIA (Formerly the Malaysian Materials Science & Technology Society)

The Malaysian Materials Science & Technology Society (MMS) was registered with the Registrar of Societies on 6th November, 1987. The MMS was actively promoting the awareness of Materials in Malaysia since 1988. In 1996, with a newly-elected Council, the change of name to the Institute of Materials, Malaysia (IMM) was submitted to the Registrar of Societies and approved on 16th June 1997. The new name was to be synergistic with the rest of the world. For example in the case of the United Kingdom, The Institute of Metals, The Institute of Ceramics and The Plastics & Rubber Institute were merged into a single Institute of Materials in 1992 where its Members are recognised as professionals with the status of a Chartered Engineer (C.Eng).

Membership to the IMM is open to all individuals and companies interested in developing the contribution of Materials science, technology and engineering towards industrial growth in Malaysia. The technology of Materials is advancing day-by-day throughout the world. We, in Malaysia, must keep up with the pace of technological advancement.

The objectives of the IMM include the training and development of individuals and companies in Malaysia to attain professional recognition in various fields of Materials science, technology and engineering. Materials cover a very wide field such as metals, polymers, rubber, wood, concrete, ceramics, semiconductors, advanced materials, cellulose, textiles, etc. Membership to the IMM will enable networking and exchange of knowledge from a very wide variety of specialized areas of expertise.

The longterm objective of the IMM is to attain professional status for its members in line with that which is accorded to the other disciplines of engineering.

The IMM is also committed to seeking affiliations with overseas Materials and Engineering/Scientific professional institutions to gain access to technological developments worldwide. This will ensure that we, in Malaysia, will not be left behind.

Definition of Materials Science and Engineering:-

Materials Science and Engineering shall include Metallurgy, Polymer Technology, Ceramics Technology, Welding Technology, Concrete Technology, Wood Technology and Advanced Materials Technology.

IMM Membership Grades

Company Member

Any company that is involved or has interest in Materials Science and Engineering will be qualified to join as a company member. All employees of a Company Member are entitled to attend Institute functions at membership rate, however, only the Principal Representative or the Alternate Representative shall have voting rights.

Ordinary Member

Any Malaysian citizen and above the age of 21 years engaged in activities related to research, development and applications in Materials Science and Engineering shall qualify for Ordinary Membership. Only Ordinary Members who meet the necessary minimum requirements may apply for transfer to corporate membership grades of Fellow, Member and Associate Member and may use the abbreviated titles upon transfer.

Honorary Fellow (Hon. F.I.M.M.)

The Council shall have the power to elect Honorary Fellows who shall be persons of eminence in science or industry. The election shall be based on a majority vote within the Council. Honorary Fellows shall enjoy such privileges as may from time to time be determined by the Council.

Fellow (F.I.M.M.)

A person at least 35 years of age with approved academic qualifications, training and 8 years relevant responsible experience that has made significant contributions to the science and practice of profession of Materials Science and Engineering or has given distinguished service to industry or education.

Member (M.I.M.M.)

A person at least 25 years of age, with approved academic qualifications and training, having at least 3 years responsible experience in Materials Science and Engineering.

A person at least 40 years of age, with at least 15 years of experience with practical responsibility, as demonstrated by thesis and interview.

Associate Member (A.M.I.M.M.)

A person at least 25 years of age, who possesses an interest in Materials Science and Engineering but will not yet have acquired the necessary experience or obtained the qualifications governing entry to Member grade. An Associate Member, on obtaining the necessary qualifications, may apply for transfer to Member grade.

Student Member

A student member shall be a person not under 17 years of age who at the time of application satisfies the Council that he has received a good general education and is studying subjects related o Materials Science and Engineering. A student member shall transfer to the grade of Ordinary Member after attaining the age of 21 years provided he or she is suitably qualified and as soon as he or she is earning a full-time salary. A Student shall not become a member of the IMM without the prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor of the university or relevant authority concerned.

Certificate of Membership

Every member shall receive a membership certificate.

Every application for membership shall be proposed and seconded by two existing ordinary members and shall be forwarded to the Honorary Secretary who shall, at the first convenient opportunity, submit it to the Council for approval. The Council may at its discretion reject any application without assigning any reason thereof.

Each company on admission shall be entitled to nominate one representative to exercise all rights of membership. Only representatives of Company membership and Ordinary members shall have the right to vote and to hold office in IMM.

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
