I am pleased to address all of you present at today's (12th) Annual General Meeting of the Institute of Materials, Malaysia and to present the Report of the Council for the past year's activities.

The previous (11th) Annual General Meeting was held on Thursday, 15<sup>TH</sup> March 2001 at Kelab Golf Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah, Shah Alam.

#### (II) MEMBERSHIPS

The number of members have reduced to below 350 in 2001 from 404 in 2000. The main reason was due to participants who registered for IMM courses, seminars and conferences. These participants signed up as Ordinary Members to obtain discounted fees and did not renew their subscription.

IMM Deputy President, who is also Chairman of Memberships Committee will be embarking on a membership drive and establish a membership benefits programme.

#### (III) WEBSITE

The IMM website <u>www.iomm.org.my</u> has been activated for one year. Feedback from members will be welcomed for improvements.

### (IV) COLLABORATION WITH OTHER INSTITUTIONS

A Memorandum of Understanding (M.O.U.) was signed with Institute of Materials, U.K. in October, 2000. IMM Immediate Past President has been in regular communication with the IOM (UK) to carry out joint activities.

#### (V) CERTIFICATION EXAMINATIONS PANEL

The IMM established the Certification Examination Panel (CEP) in 2001, an independent examinations body, overseen by representatives from academic institutions to ensure impartiality and professionalism in the administration of IMM's certification examinations.

#### (VI) FEES FOR RETIREES, ETC

The IMM Council has proposed to consider special discount on membership fees due to retirement, unemployment, sickness, family circumstances or other special reasons.

#### (VII) PERMANENT SECRETARIAT

The IMM has been operating its Secretariat on a temporary basis and all activities have been contracted out to "Activity Organizers". The IMM Council has proposed to establish a company owned by the IMM under a Board of Trustees to operate a permanent Secretariat and to organize all activities directly or with the co-operation of Activity Organizers.

### (VIII) SCHEDULED MAJOR ACTIVITIES FOR 2002

- \* 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> May 2002: International Conference on "Engineering Materials in the Millenium" in Miri, Sarawak. Organized by IMM Sarawak Committee.
- \* December, 2002: National Conference on "Electron Microscopy" in Johor. Organized jointly by Universiti Teknologi Malaysia and IMM Southern Region Committee.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to Council Members for their commitment and hard work during the past Council Term (2000-2002) and hope those eligible for re-election will continue to contribute their resources for another Council Term (2002-2004).

I would also like to express my sincere gratitude to all Working Committee Members and all IMM members who have helped IMM come this far.

MINUTES OF THE 12<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTE OF MATERIALS, MALAYSIA HELD AT 11:30 A.M. AT SUMMIT HOTEL, SUBANG JAYA, SELANGOR D.E. ON SATURDAY, 23<sup>RD</sup> MARCH, 2002.

#### (1) Attendance

The meeting was attended by 40 members ( attendance list attached ). The quorum required is twice the number of Council Members i.e.  $19 \times 2 = 38$  members.

#### (2) Review of Previous Minutes

The Minutes of the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting were reviewed. No comments were raised. The minutes were proposed accepted by Dr. Samad Solbai and seconded by Dr. Teh Ser Kok.

#### (3) Report of the Council for 2001

The Report of the Council was presented by the President, Dr. A. Rahim Nor.

#### (3.1) Activities

The President reported that the IMM had another very eventful year with at least one activity every month. The list of activities were presented in the report. In addition, one issue of the Journal of the IMM (JIMM) was published in 2001. The IMM Southern Region Committee also held a joint-workshop on Metallography with Universiti Teknologi Malaysia in 2001.

#### (3.2) Memberships

Membership renewals had not been satisfactory. It was identified that many members had registered for the benefit of getting member's discount for courses and seminars, and subsequently did not see the need to renew their membership. The Memberships Committee, chaired by the Deputy President, has been assigned the task to identify and implement more attractive membership benefits to retain members as well as to attract new members.

#### (3.3) Website

The IMM website <u>www.iomm.org.my</u> has improved over the past one year. However, the website can be improved further and members were encouraged to provide suggestions.

#### (3.4) Collaboration With Other Institutions

The Immediate Past President has been assigned the task to activate the collaboration activities with the Institute of Materials, U.K. and the Board of Engineers, Malaysia to enhance the status of the IMM professional certifications.

#### (3.5) Certification Examinations Panel

The IMM had established an independent Certification Examinations Panel (C.E.P.) headed by Dr. Mohd. Kamal Harun of UiTM. The C.E.P. will ensure impartiality and professionalism in the administration of IMM's certification examinations.

#### (3.6) Fees For Retirees

The Council has proposed a 50% special discount off membership fees for retired personnel and those affected by sickness, unemployment, as well as other special circumstances on a case-by-case basis. Members welcomed this proposal unanimously.

#### (3.7) Permanent IMM Secretariat

The IMM has been operating its Secretariat at a temporary location and all activities have been contracted out to "Activity Organizers". The IMM Council has proposed to establish a private limited company fully owned by the IMM and operating under a Board of Trustees, to operate its own Secretariat office and employ staff to organize all activities itself or with the co-operation of Activity Organizers.

In accordance to IMM Rules, clause 3.4.1 and clause 3.7.3, the Council may invest IMM's funds in securities, and purchase and sell property, to advance the objectives and interests of the IMM.

It was proposed by the IMM Council to acquire an existing dormant company and subsequently to change the company name to suit the role of the IMM, as this would be a quicker and better route to establish the required IMM company name. The IMM company will initially rent an office premise and employ its own staff.

The members voted unanimously to accept the Council' proposals for the set-up of the IMM company and its operational requirements.

#### (3.8) Major Activities for 2002

The Council reported two major events scheduled for 2002 and requested members to support the events.

- (i) International Conference on "Engineering Materials in the Millenium" on 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2002 in Holiday Inn, Miri, Sarawak. Organized by the IMM Sarawak Committee.
- (ii) National Conference on Electron Microscopy in December, 2002 in Johor Baru. Jointly organized by IMM Southern Region Committee, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia, and Electron Microscopy Society of Malaysia.

The Council's Report and proposals were proposed accepted by Ir. Chong Chien Fatt and seconded by Mr. Kang Kim Ang.

#### (4) Statement of Accounts for 2001

The Hon. Treasurer presented the audited accounts for the financial year ending 31st December, 2001.

The total income received was RM668,267.00

The net surplus, after lessing expenditure, was RM2,899.00

The lower surplus compared to the previous year was due to higher operating costs as a result of increased number of Council and Working Committee meetings during the year. The various committees had worked very hard to develop new courses, new syllabi, and improvements to existing courses.

The Council had proposed to increase the royalty to be paid by Activity Organizers to IMM from 12% to 20%. This increase shall be implemented in stages and Activity Organizers will be informed accordingly.

The net asset of the IMM as at 31-12-2001 = RM98,754.00

#### (5) Election of Council Members

The President informed that, in accordance to the IMM Rules clause 3.3.2.2, the Deputy President, Hon. Secretary and the Hon. Treasurer have to retire at the end of the Council Session and may offer themselves for re-election within the Council at the penultimate Council Meeting before the Annual General Meeting. As no other candidates have been nominated for the 3 posts, En. Zainuddin Ishak offered himself for re-election as Deputy President, Ir. Ong Chong Hup offered himself for re-election as Hon. Secretary, and Ir. Mohd Suradi Yasin offered himself for re-election as Hon. Treasurer. During the penultimate Council Meeting held on 7th March, 2002, the Council had unanimously re-elected the 3 candidates to their respective posts.

In accordance to IMM Rules clause 3.3.2.3, only 7 Council Members shall be elected during the Annual General Meeting.

The President informed that on the closing date of the nomination for Council Members, only seven (7) nominations for Council Members were received. The candidates were :-

- (1) Dr. Teh Ser Kok (FIMM no:018)
- (2) Dr. Mohamad Kamal Harun (FIMM no:117)
- (3) Dr. Radzali Othman (FIMM no:536)
- (4) Mr. Kang Kim Ang (FIMM no:012)
- (5) Ir. Chong Chien Fatt (FIMM no:191)
- (6) Dr. Edwin Jong Nyon Tchan (FIMM no:490)
- (7) Ir. Mohd. Raziff Embi (FIMM no:002)

Since only 7 candidates were nominated, the seven candidates were automatically elected as Council Members for the Council Session for 2002-2004.

Eight (8) more candidates will be appointed by the Council to cater for the various disciplines of Materials Science & Engineering and to cater for the other regions around the country.

#### (6) External Auditors for 2002

The Hon. Treasurer proposed to continue with the appointment of Er & Associates as the External Auditor for the IMM for the year 2002.

The proposal was proposed accepted by Mr. David Lim Chee Cheong and seconded by Mr. Kang Kim Ang.

#### (7) Internal Auditors for 2002

The President proposed Mr. Barry Loi Chee Chien and Mr. Frankie Chua Cheng Huat to be appointed as Internal Auditors for a one-year appointment.

The proposal was proposed accepted by Dr. Samad Solbai and seconded by Dr. Mohd Kamal Harun.

#### (8) Other Matters

(8.1) Mr. David Lim Chee Cheong suggested that the IMM should organize more evening talks, both technical and non-technical. The IMM Council will take note of this suggestion and advise the respective Working Committees to act upon it.

With no other matters, the President expressed his vote of thanks to the out-going Council Members and hope the new Council will continue the efforts to develop the IMM's potential as a progressive professional institute.

The President declared the Annual General Meeting closed at 12:15 p.m.

# IMM CORROSION CONFERENCE AND EXHIBITION, MIRI, SARAWAK 23<sup>rd</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup> May 2002

The Institute of Materials Malaysia (IMM), Sarawak Committee has successfully organised its first IMM Corrosion & Materials Conference and Exhibition from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> May 2002 at Holiday Inn Hotel, Miri, Sarawak. The conference theme was "Engineering Materials in the Millenium", with objectives of sharing amongst the regional professionals on advancement of Science, engineering and technology as well as to encourage and promote R&D in the fields of materials science between the industrial sectors, research industries, manufacturing industries and universities, etc.

The conference was attended by over 300 delegates from Malaysia, Brunei, Japan, UK and Australia, etc. A total of 24 papers were presented during the conference.

The conference was officiated by Deputy Chief Minister of Sarawak, YB Tan Sri Datuk Amar Dr. George Chan Hong Nam. During his opening speech, he congratulated IMM Sarawak for taking the initiative of organizing the international standard conference. He also urged IMM to play its role as a link between R&D to the applicators and consumers. R&D should be focused on industrial needs and development with priority given to the impact on society and environment, he said.

He pointed out that the progression of technology had led to a quantum leap in the past 60 years in the understanding of materials types and accessibility, which had unleashed sophisticated products with lower cost and shorter period. He foresaw the future needs of materials to be challenging and widespread, particularly in relation to energy sector such as nuclear, reducing cost in transportation, alternatives economical sources of energy and improvement of environmental quality. This is a challenge for materials scientists, technologists, and engineers in search of materials development to produce more suitable products taking into account, the life cycle cost.

In this context, he said the holding of conference to discuss and seek solutions to the challenges faced by material scientist, technological experts as well as engineers was timely. He further stressed that more funds from public and private sectors should be channelled into research and development in the country to boost materials base industries.

The IMM Sarawak Chairman, Puan Maimunah Ismail who also spoke during the function thanked the Sarawak Government for their support and contribution to the conference. She was pleased with the level of participation and support from various industries both from within the country as well as from overseas. On behalf of the organizing committees, she expressed their deepest gratitude for the support and assistance from the Sarawak Government, IMM council, sponsors, delegates, exhibitors, presenters and advertisers who have contributed to the success of the conference. She hoped to see similar support to IMM Sarawak future event and conference.

The opening ceremony was attended by VIP's from the local oil&gas companies, Miri Municipal council, IMM President, and contractors.



#### **Ordinary Member**

#### Fellow (F.I.M.M.)

A person at least 35 years of age with approved academic qualifications, training and 8 years relevant responsible experience that has made significant contributions to the science and practice of profession of Materials Science and Engineering or has given distinguished service to industry or education.

#### Member (M.I.M.M.)

A person at least 25 years of age, with approved academic qualifications and training, having at least 3 years responsible experience in Materials Science and Engineering.

OR

A person at least 40 years of age, with at least 15 years of experience with practical responsibility, as demonstrated by thesis and interview.

#### Associate Member (A.M.I.M.M.)

A person at least 25 years of age, who possesses an interest in Materials Science and Engineering but will not yet have acquired the necessary experience or obtained the qualifications governing entry to Member grade. An Associate Member, on obtaining the necessary qualifications, may apply for transfer to Member grade.

#### Student Member

A student member shall be a person not under 17 years of age who at the time of application satisfies the Council that he has received a good general education and is studying subjects related o Materials Science and Engineering. A student member shall transfer to the grade of Ordinary Member after attaining the age of 21 years provided he or she is suitably qualified and as soon as he or she is earning a full-time salary. A Student shall not become a member of the IMM without the prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor of the university or relevant authority concerned.

#### Certificate of Membership

Every member shall receive a membership certificate.

Every application for membership shall be proposed and seconded by two existing ordinary members and shall be forwarded to the Honorary Secretary who shall, at the first convenient opportunity, submit it to the Council for approval. The Council may at its discretion reject any application without assigning any reason thereof.

Each company on admission shall be entitled to nominate one representative to exercise all rights of membership. Only representatives of Company membership and Ordinary members shall have the right to vote and to hold office in IMM.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO IMM RULES

#### AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 1.3 AND ADDITION OF SECTION XI

The Council of the Institute of Materials, Malaysia (IMM) has proposed to establish a private limited company fully-owned by the IMM and managed by a Board of Directors appointed by the IMM for the purpose of conducting business activities on behalf of the IMM.

The IMM has been operating with volunteers from the government and private sectors with the assistance of private activity organizers. The IMM Council realizes the limitations of volunteers in overseeing the activity organizers. As such, the IMM Council proposes to employ full-time staff under a wholly-owned private limited company fully-dedicated to carry-out the objectives of the IMM.

#### AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 1.3

Clause 1.3 of the IMM Rules spell out the objectives of the IMM. The existing Rules contain four objectives listed from (a) to (d). An additional objective, listed as item (e) shall be added as follows:-

- 1.3 The objectives of the IMM shall include the following:
- (a) to encourage education in Materials Science and Engineering.
- (b) to promote research and development in the fields of Materials Science and Engineering.
- (c) to encourage collaboration between the industrial sectors, research institutes and universities.
- (d) to promote honourable practice and professional etiquette among members of the IMM.
- (e) to set up wholly-owned subsidiary companies registered under the Companies Act to undertake activities for the IMM and to operate business and investment activities beneficial to the IMM. Such companies shall be managed by a Board of Directors appointed by the Management Committee in accordance to IMM Rules Section XI.

#### ADDITION OF NEW SECTION XI

#### XI MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- 11.1 The financial assets of the Institute of Materials, Malaysia (IMM) shall be managed by a Management Committee in accordance to IMM Rules Section VIII.
- 11.2 The Management Committee of five members shall comprise of the following:-
  - IMM President (in the Chair)
  - IMM Deputy President
  - IMM Honorary Secretary
  - IMM Honorary Treasurer
  - IMM Immediate Past President

Should any of the above office-bearers decline to be a member of the Management Committee, the IMM Council may nominate a Council Member to fill up the vacancy.

- 11.3 The Management Committee shall meet at least four times a year or as regularly as deemed necessary for the resolution of issues pertaining to activities of the IMM, and planning for the future of the IMM.
- 11.4 Quorum for Management Committee meetings shall be 3 out of 5.
- 11.5 All meetings shall be minuted by the Hon. Secretary and signed by the Chairman as evidence of the due passing of any resolution and of the amount of the majority in favour thereof. The results of resolutions and decisions made shall be announced at subsequent IMM Council Meetings.
- 11.6 The Management Committee shall oversee the set-up of wholly-owned subsidiary companies registered under the Companies Act to undertake activities for the IMM or to operate business activities beneficial to the IMM, as allowed for in the IMM Rules clause number 1.3 (e) 3.4.1 & 3.7.3. Such companies shall be managed by a Board of Directors appointed by the Management Committee. All profits and proceeds obtained through involvement in business and investment activities of the IMM shall be for the purpose of development, growth, and achieving the objectives of the IMM and none of the profits and monies gained shall be used to pay benefits or bonus to any individual member. However, this provision shall not prohibit any payment made for the good cause, to pay salaries, benefits, and expenditures to any working/active members, workers, and staff of the IMM.

- 11.7 The Chairman, and in his absence, the Deputy Chairman shall preside at each meeting. In the absence of both, either one of the remaining 3 committee members shall preside over the meeting, based on mutual consent.
- 11.8 Investments and businesses of wholly-owned subsidiary companies of the IMM shall be overseen by the Board of Directors appointed by the Management Committee. The day-to-day running of the businesses shall be carried out by permanent staff employed by the businesses.
- 11.9 The Board of Directors shall provide monthly reports to the Management Committee for review.
- 11.10 The shares of the IMM shall be held in trust by a Board of Trustees appointed by the Management Committee. A Trust Deed shall be drawn up between the IMM and the Board of Trustees.
